



The equipped playground will impress the small visitors with its toys and constructions. As for people with disabilities, the hotel is 100% suitable for disabled people, providing full access to all areas and services.



The 4-star complex consists of a total of 132 comfortable rooms with a terrace or balcony. will be the dancing floor!




Located on the beach, in the heart of Kefalos Bay "Kordistos" hotel provides authentic hospitality and unique relaxing moments in one of the most beautiful spots on the island. The blue colors and the familiar image of the Aegean Sea greet you upon your arrival. Once you settle in and make your first walk around the hotel premises, the uniqueness of the landscape and the joy of exploration will surely lead you to the beach, in

order to hear the waves getting to the shore! At the back of the building, blue is interrupted by green: a vivid lawn surrounding the pool and restaurant and paved paths that lead you to the sandy beach.

The hotel offers airy and spacious air-conditioning rooms, tastefully decorated and fully equipped with everything you need to enjoy your stay including Wi-Fi, lounge, restaurant and bar, swimming pool and children's pool, playground, and sun beds at the pool and the beach. For anything else you might need Kamari, the port of Kefalos, is just a few minutes' walk away and has a variety of restaurants, taverns, as well as cafes, bars and supermarkets.



Like living in a postcard! The beautiful Kefalos Bay, with clear, crystal waters and the small island with the chapel of St. Nicholas is by far the most beautiful and photographed spot on Kos. Of course, the islet Kastri as the locals call it, is the landscape reference point, and despite its size, the disproportionately large rock in the center creates an imposing image, that of an old castle or a miniature volcano! The distance that separates the island from the beach is minimal, and you can easily swim across, as most of our visitors do. Kordistos Hotel is located right in the center of the bay, on the beachside. You just need to walk a few meters to reach the closest point, where you can dive to swim across. Besides the Kastri island, Kefalos bay has more to see and do. At the start of the bay, you can find the best beaches on the island, the famous Paradise Beach, "Camel" and more. Further down, you can visit the Christian basilica of St. Stephen, of the 5th century BC, literally on the beach, an almost unique location with ancient ruins, marbles and columns by the sea. On the other side of the bay, one can find Kamari, the small village-port of Kefalos, waterfront





The green and lush island of Kos is an island of many choices, there is so much to see that a week or two just won't do, and that's one of the reasons people keep coming back to the island of Hippocrates. The island has been quite rich ever since ancient times, the fertile soil have blessed the locals with grapes for wine, wheat, fruits and olives as well as obsidian and rich fishing waters. Mythology has it that the three giants Phoebos, Kinnas and Kios fled to this island after they had been defeated at the great battle of the gods and the Titans. Hercules supposedly stayed here for a while after he had performed his 12 Labors. The king of the Carians led his people to the island sometime in the 2nd Millennium BC, and this people from Asia Minor are traditionally considered to have been one of the first settlers on this island. They were succeeded by the Minoans, Cretans, and then, in the 10th century BC, the Dorians arrived. At this time the island was called Meropida. From an early stage, the god of medicine, Asclepius, was worshipped here, and pilgrims from all over came to his temple to go through cleansing rituals, sleep in the temple, and be cured. It is no coincidence that the father of medicine, Hippocrates, was born here. In the 4th century BC Kos joined sides with the Macedonians, and the Romans conquered the island in the 2nd century BC. St. Paul the Apostle visited the island on one of his missions, and some of the earliest churches of Greece were built here. The Genuans and Venetians ruled the island in the 12th century, but it came under the command of the Knights of Rhodes in 1315. The Turks occupied the island in 1522, and massacres and harsh treatment of the people followed.

Kos was given to Italy in 1912, and freed in 1948.
